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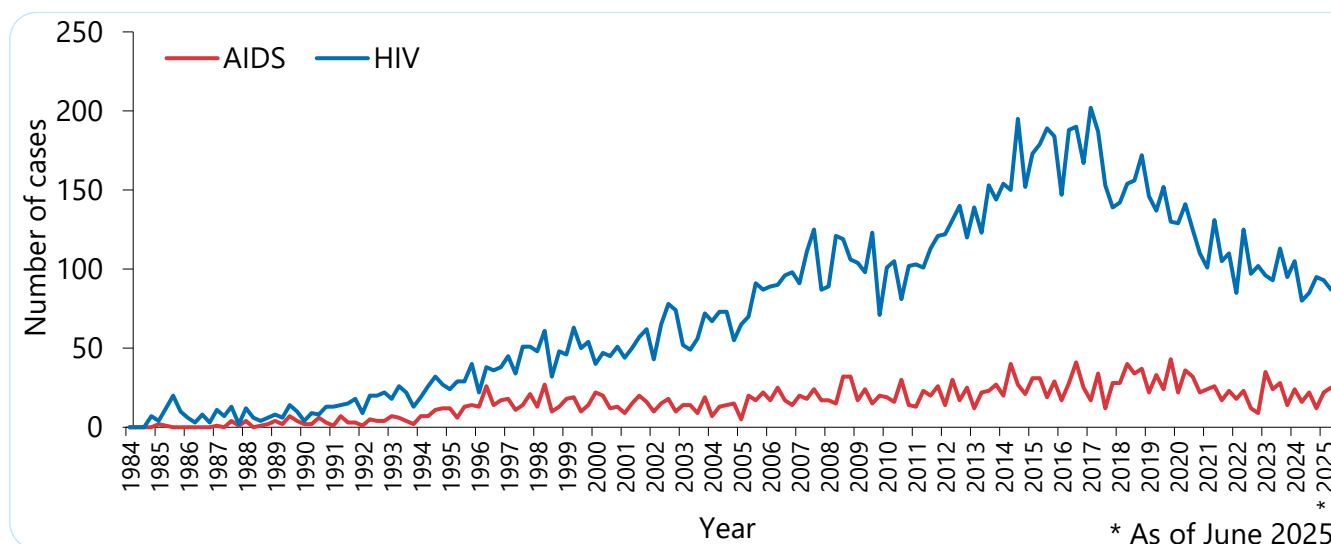

Chart 2.1 Age-gender distribution of newly reported cases of HIV infection (first half of 2025)

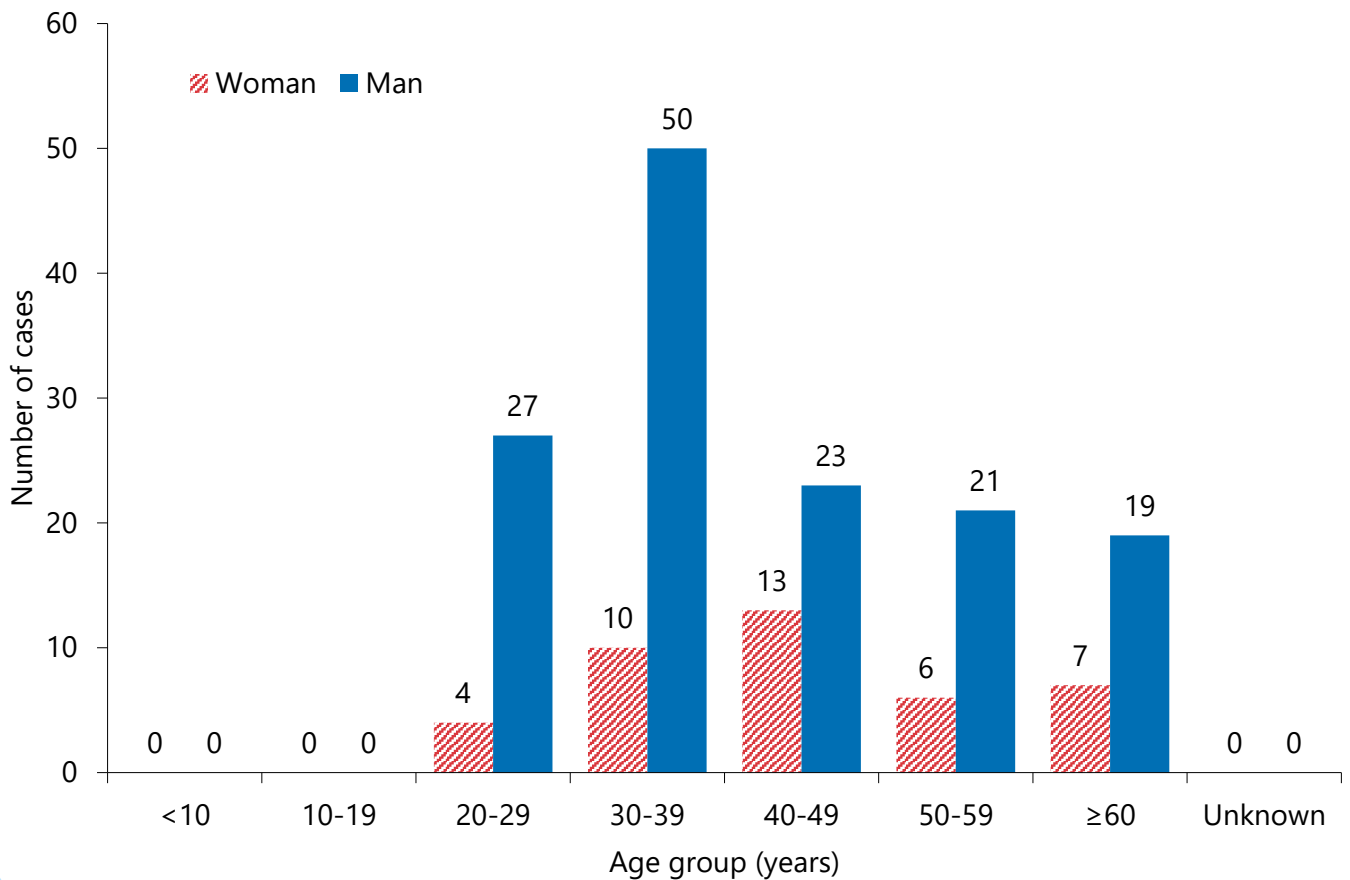


Chart 2.2 Quarterly number of newly reported cases of HIV infection by gender

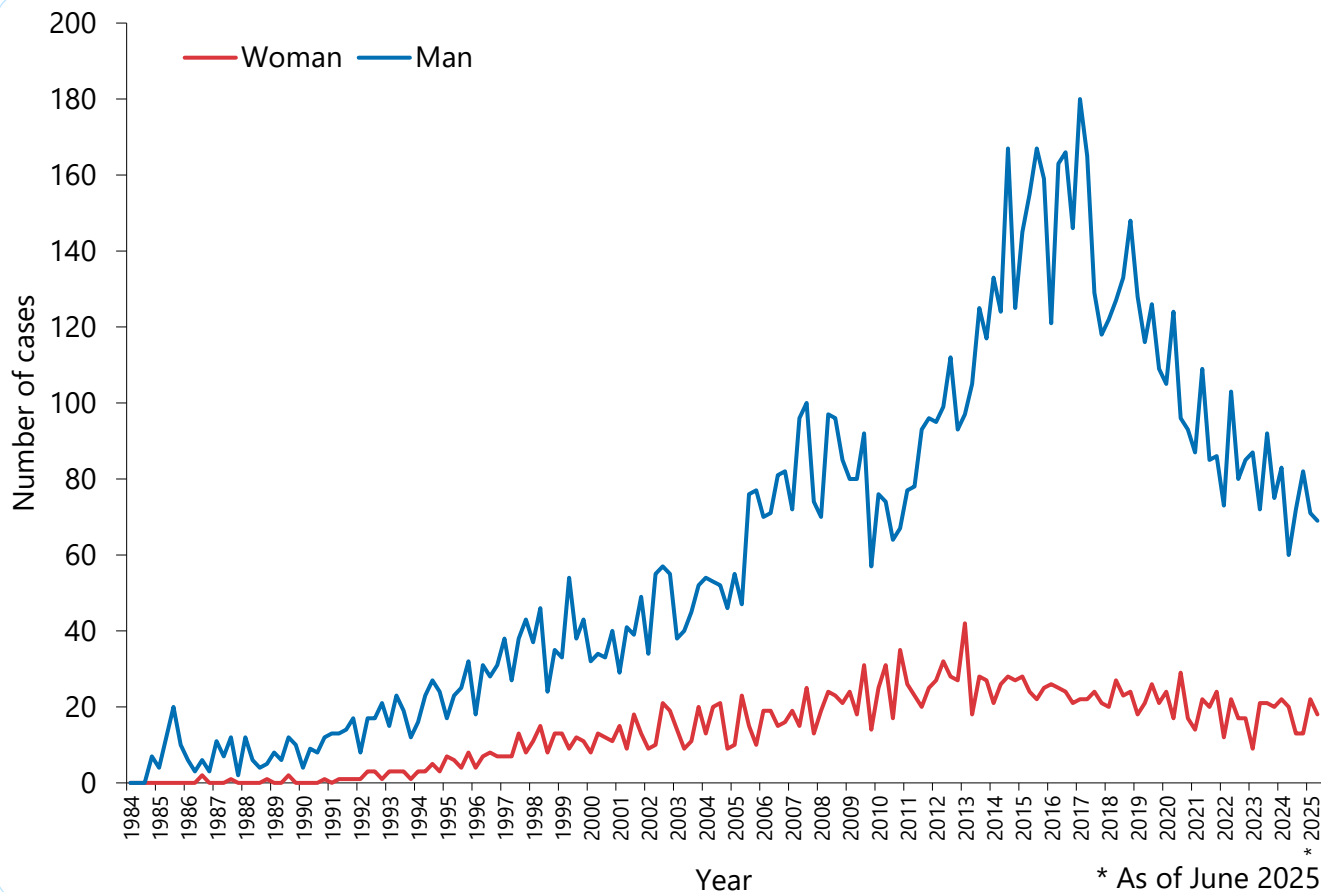


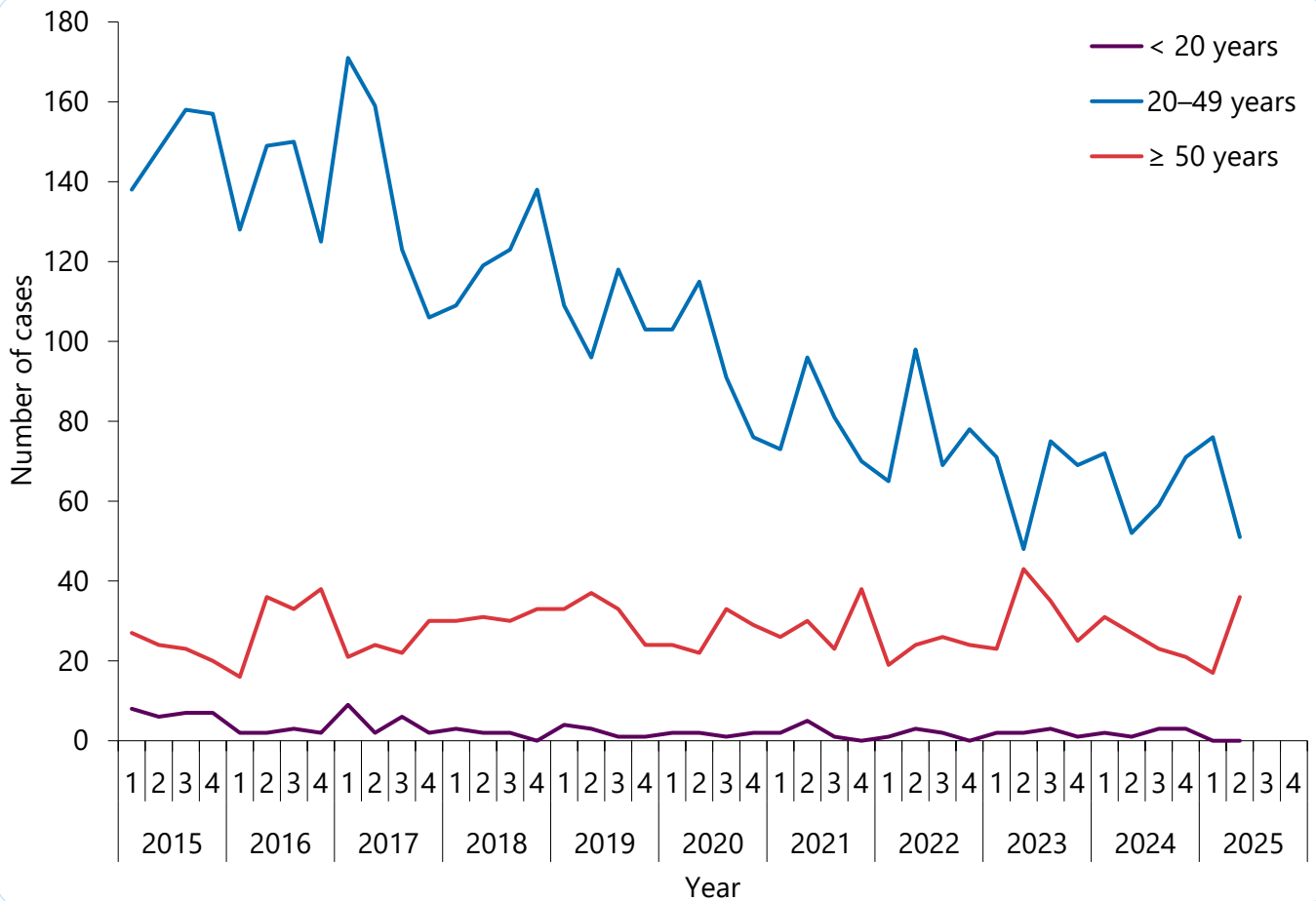
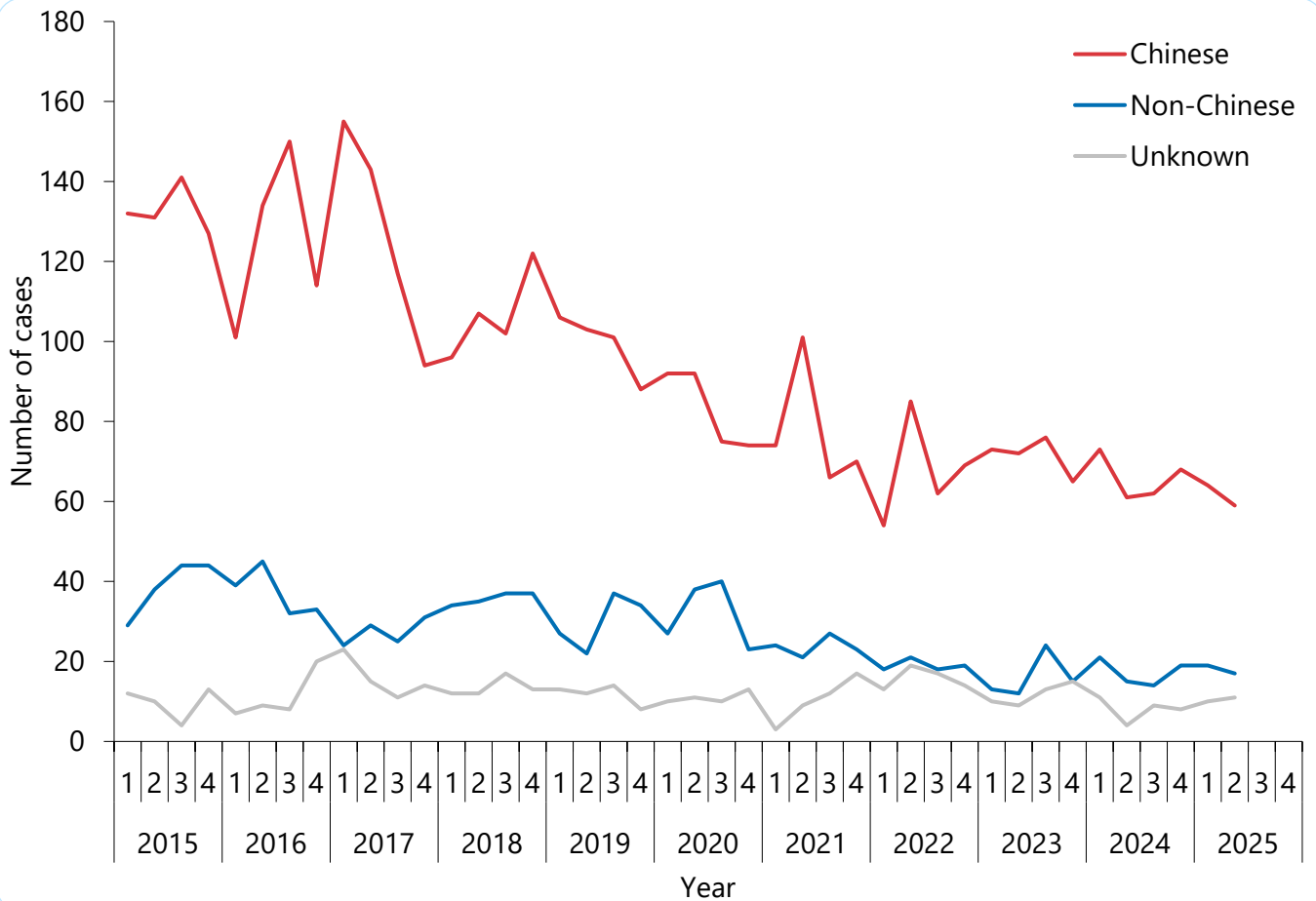
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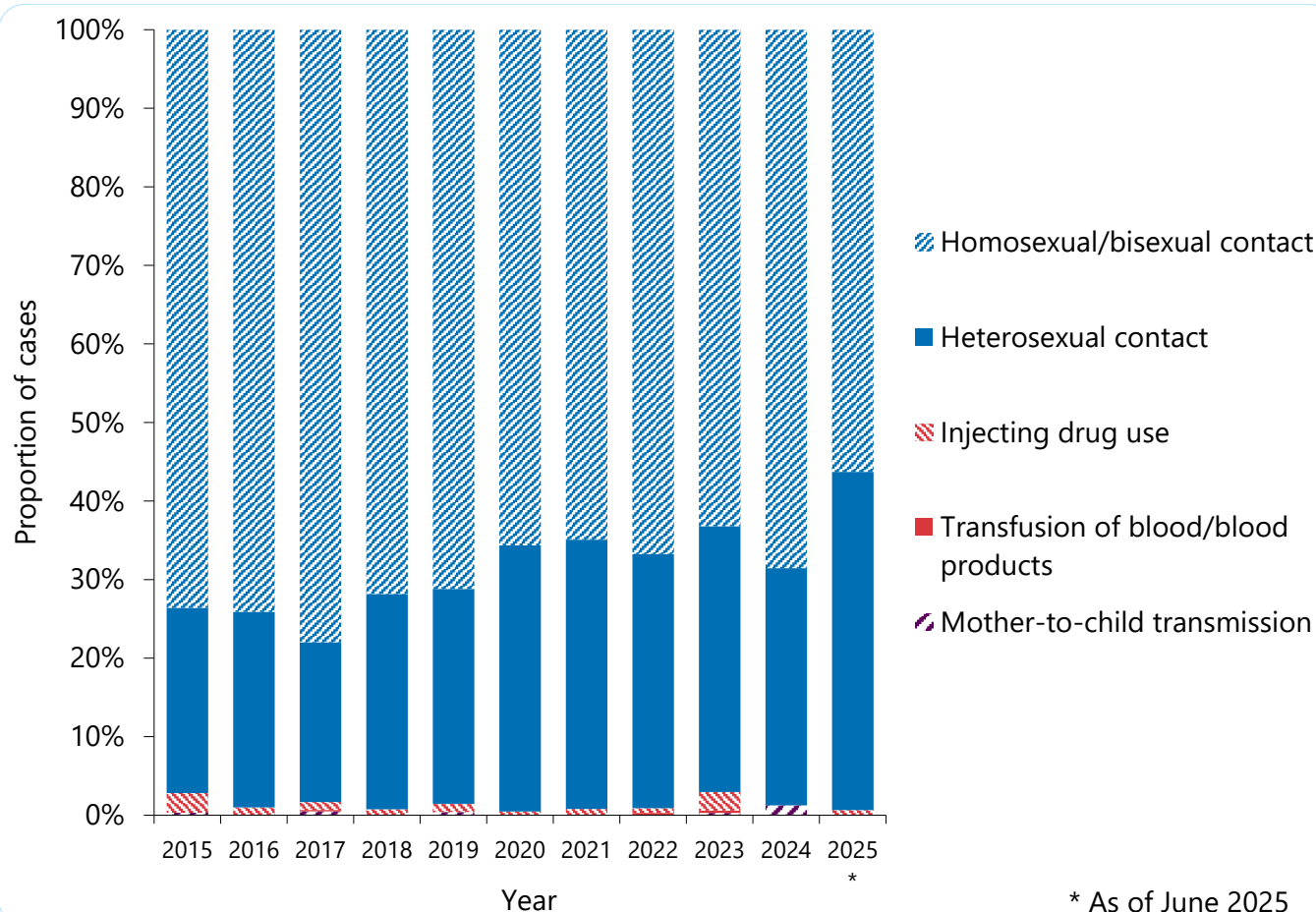
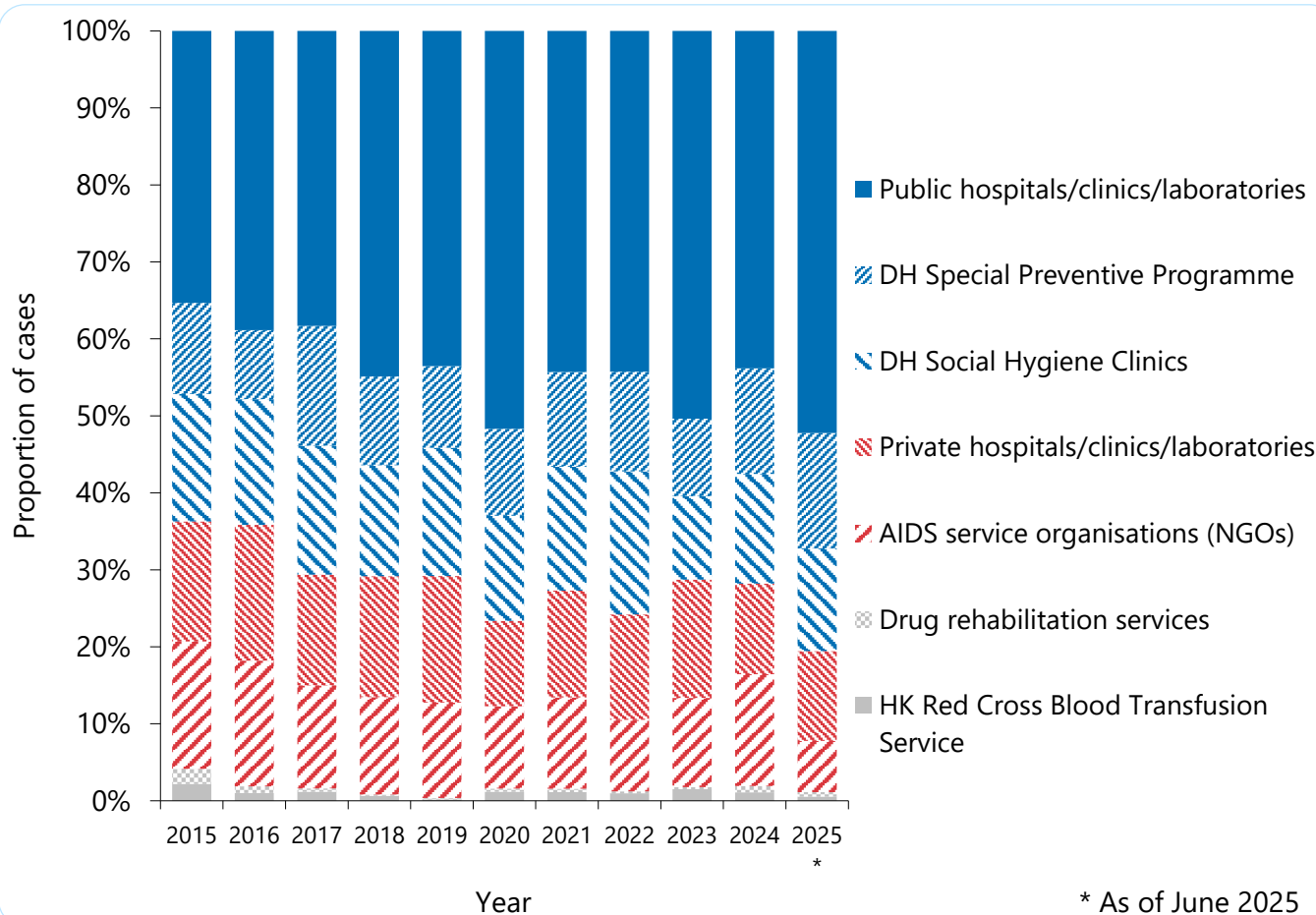
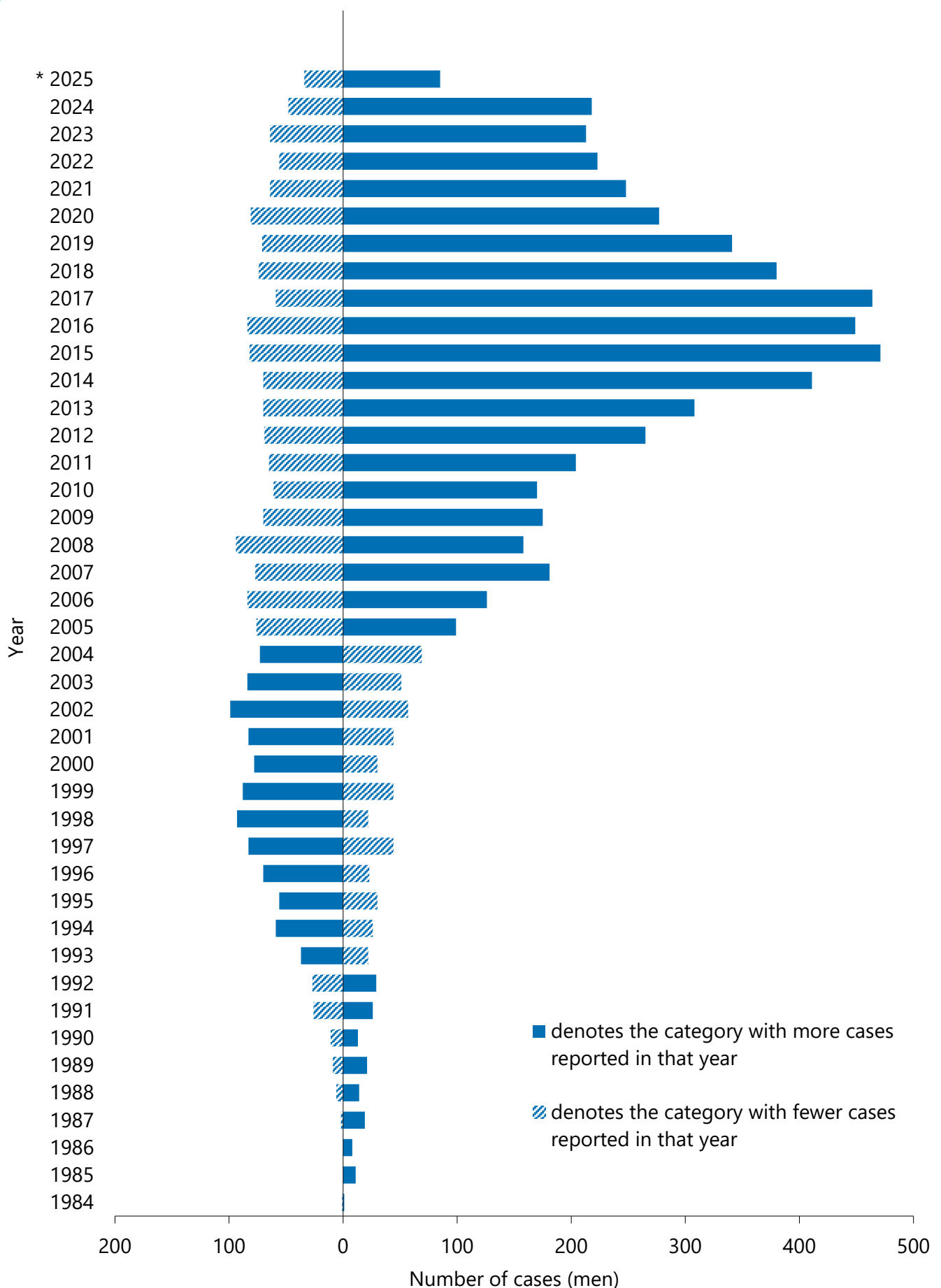
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Chart 2.7 Number of men reported to have acquired HIV infection via heterosexual versus homosexual/bisexual contact by year

Chart 3.1 Age-gender distribution of newly reported AIDS cases (first half of 2025)

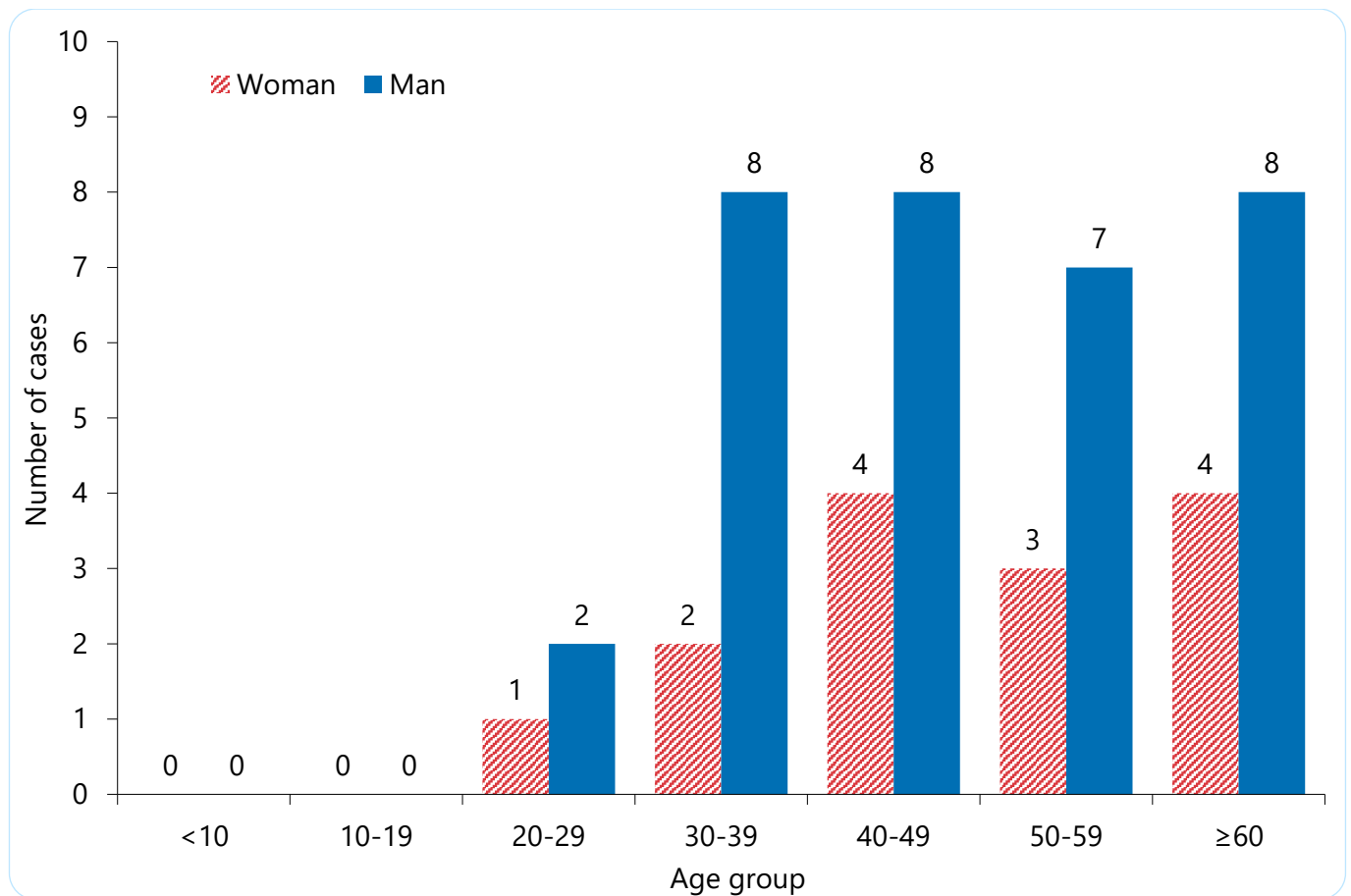


Chart 3.2 Quarterly number of newly reported AIDS cases by gender

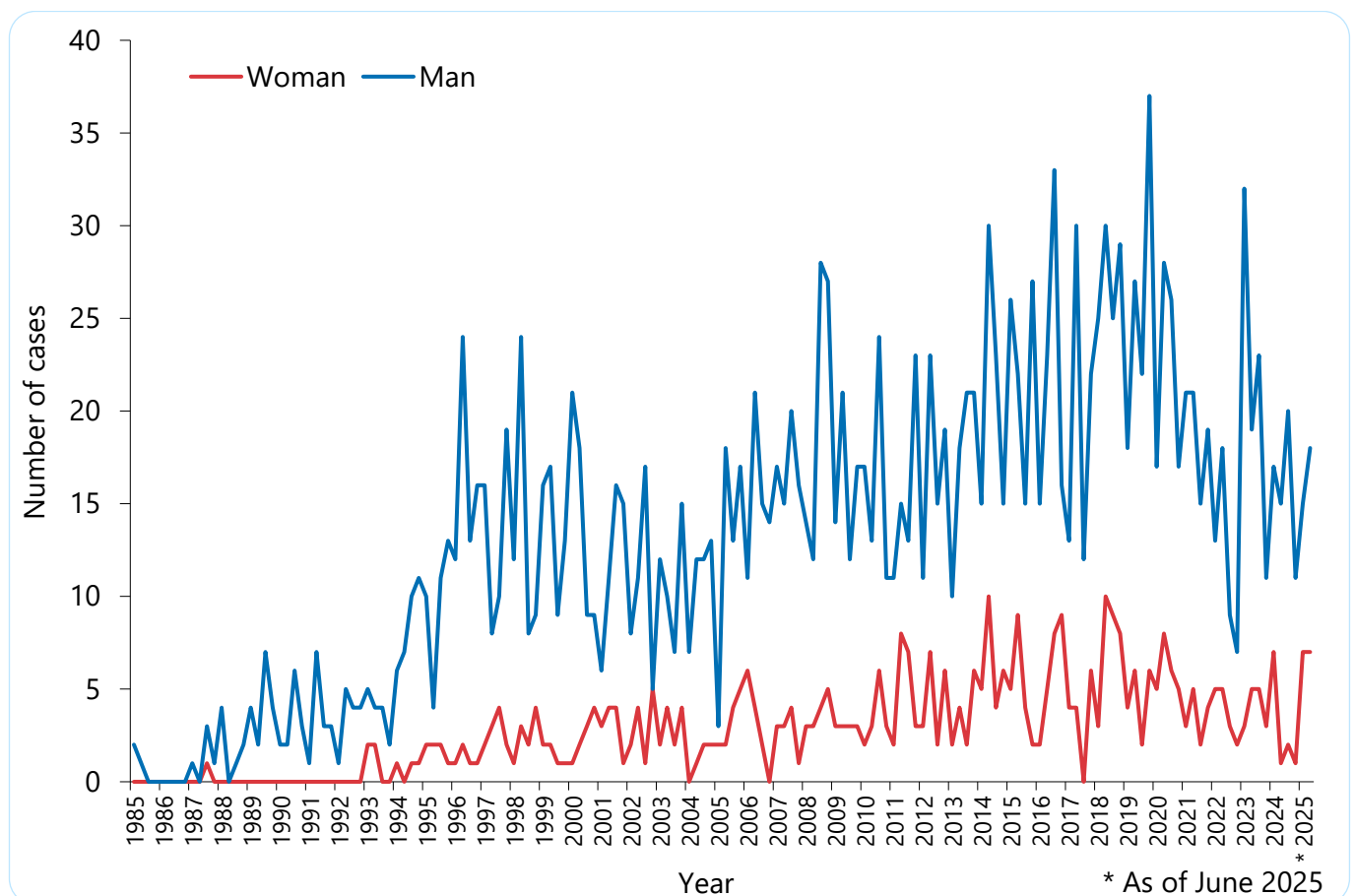


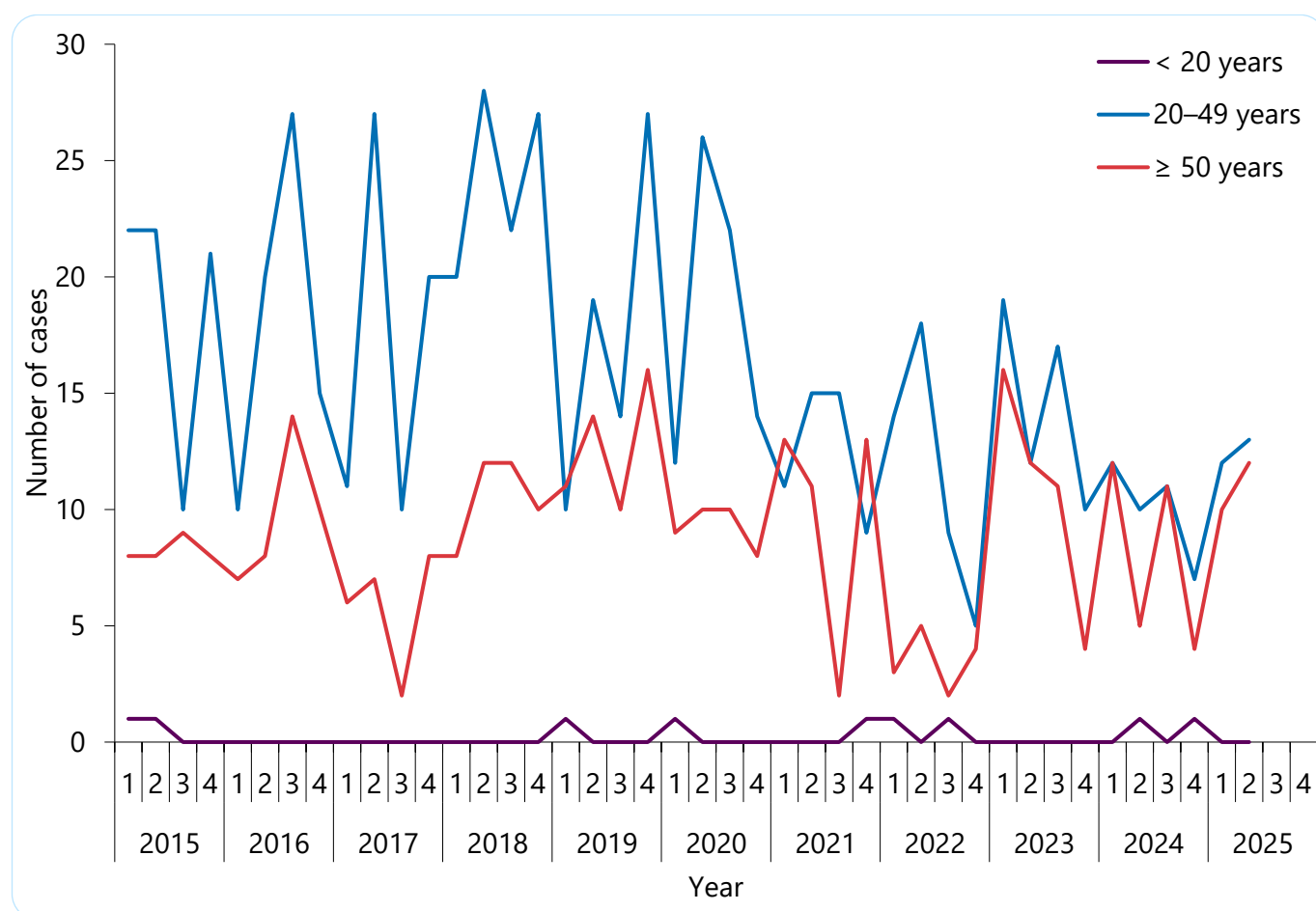
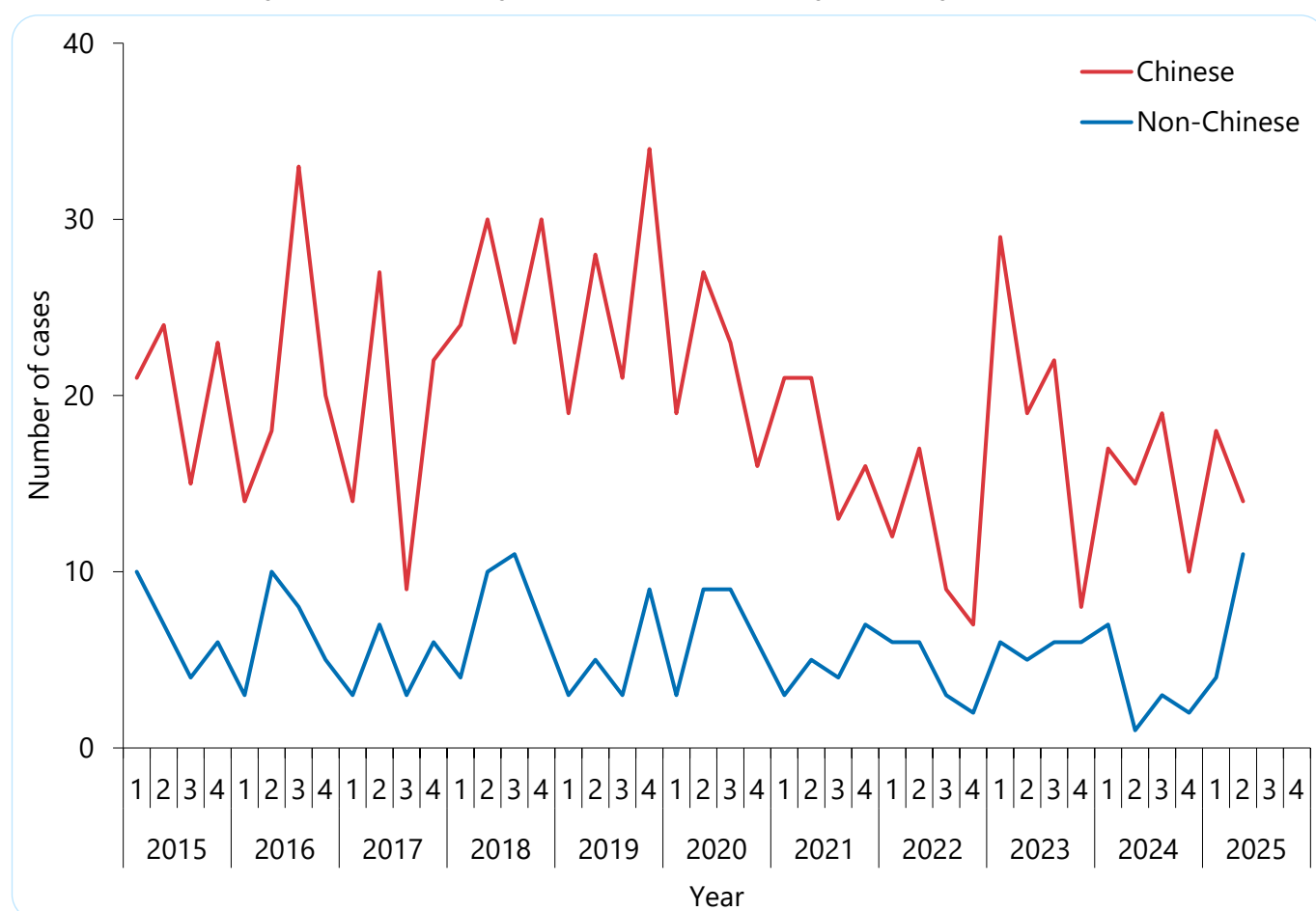
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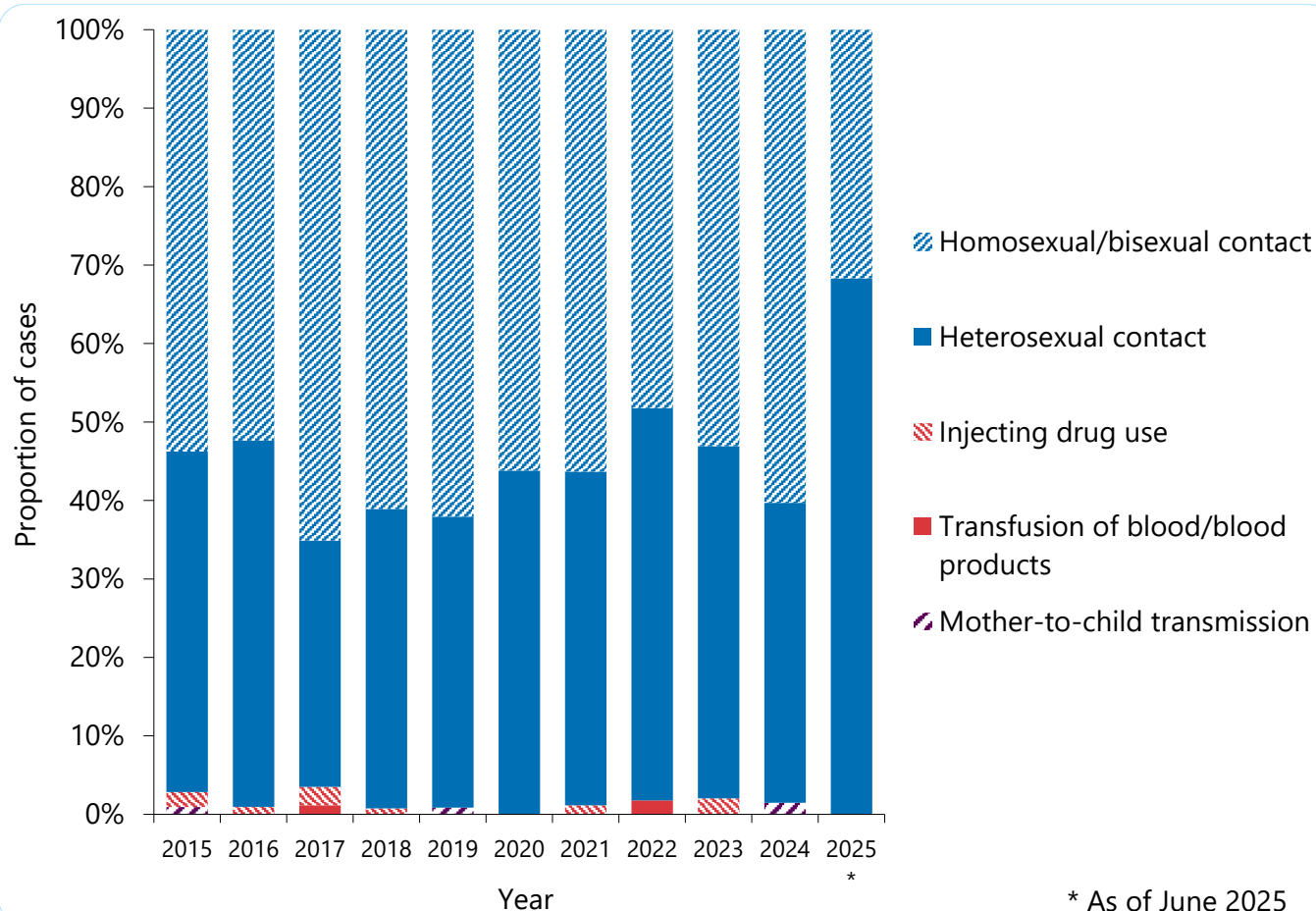
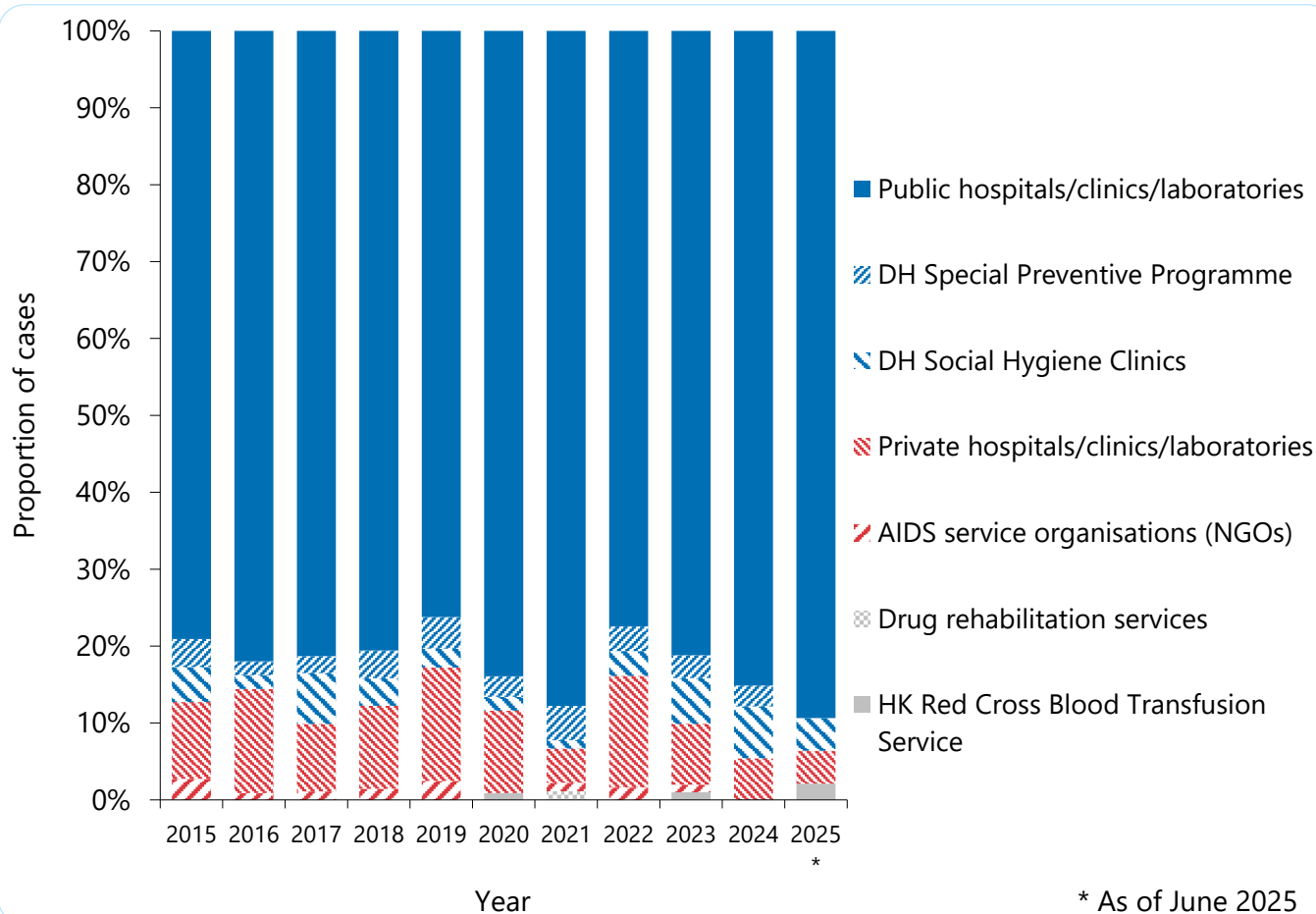
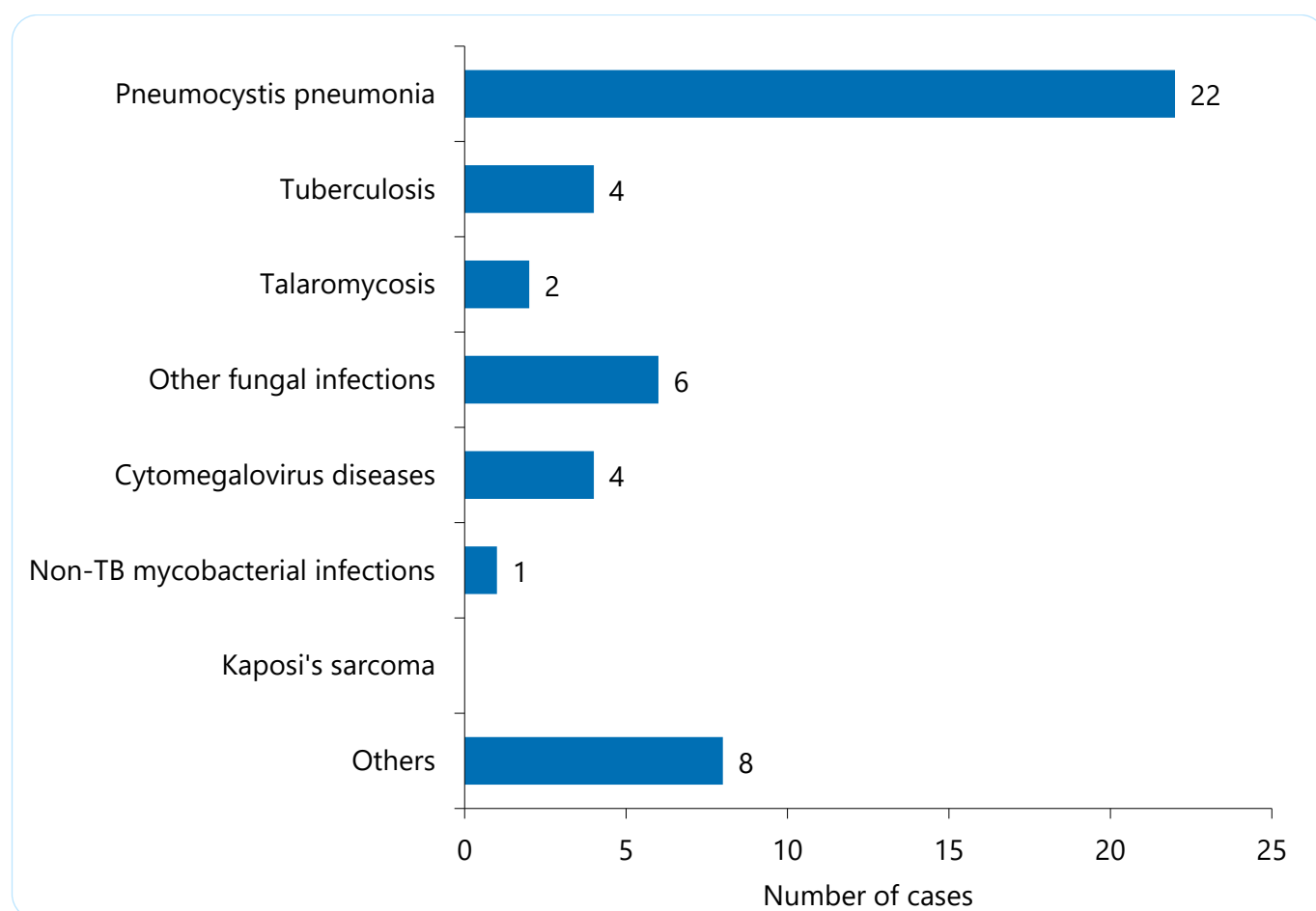
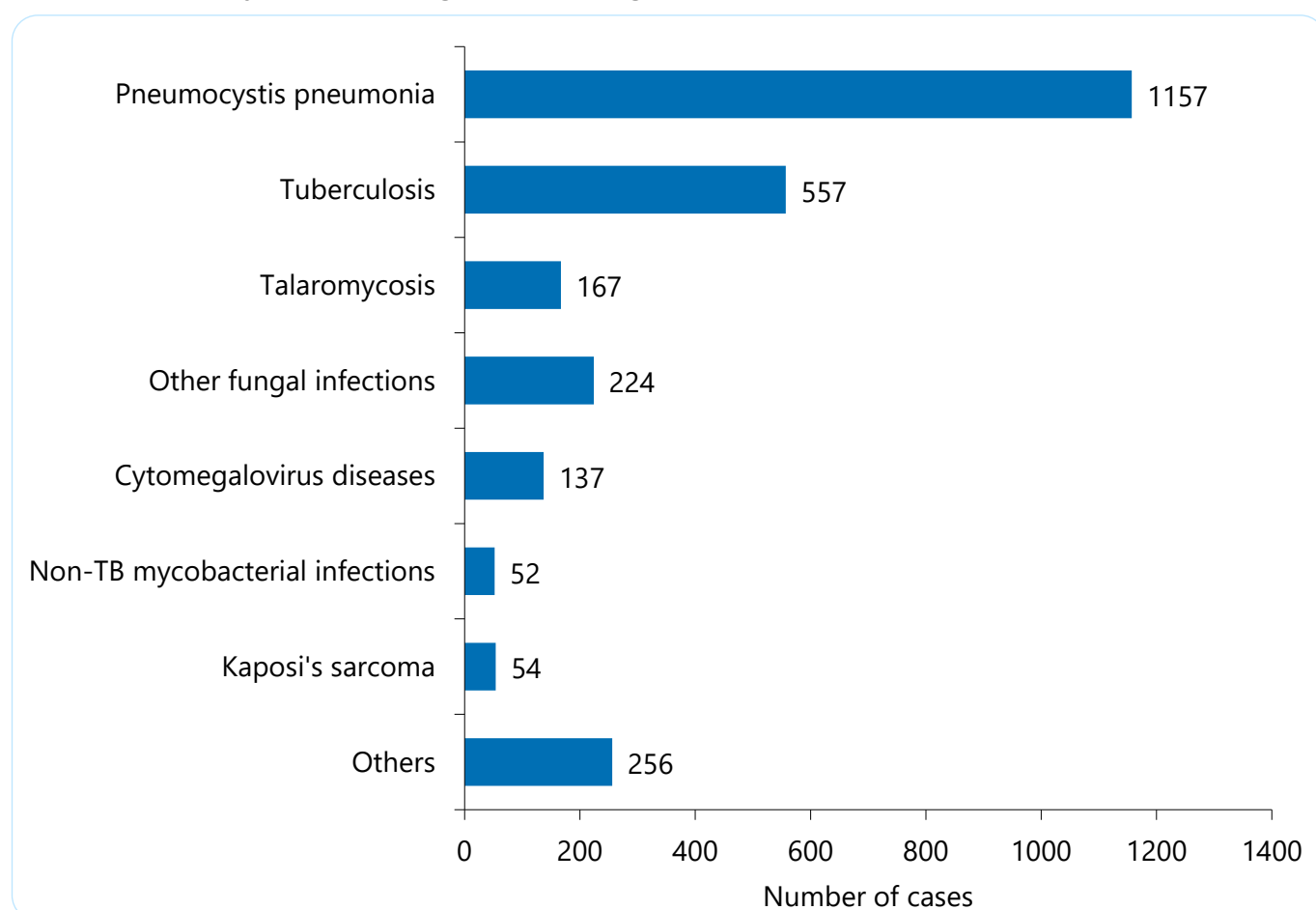
